map B-2 Japanese Cuisine Kanazawa Sta. Area

Kaga Cuisine Daimyo Chaya

Just a three-minute walk from Kanazawa Station, the long-established Kaga cuisine restaurant Daimyo Chaya is renowned for its exquisite crab dishes. Sourced directly from local fishing boats and kept in large tanks filled with deep ocean water, the crab is prized for its exceptional freshness and sweet, succulent meat.



Point



◀ Crab is also available through the online shop—lifted from the tank on the morning of shipment, freshly boiled, and delivered chilled without freezing for peak quality.



◀ Crab at Daimyo Chaya is sourced directly from local boats and kept fresh in 8-ton deep-sea water tanks, offering plump, springy meat.

National Crafts Museum

The National Crafts Museum specializes in modern and contemporary crafts and design. In addition to collection and special exhibitions focusing on certain topics, it has the relocated studio of lacquer artist MATSUDA Gonroku, a digital system for crafts appreciation, an art library with a collection of specialized books, and a museum shop featuring original products. Another highlight is the buildings, former army facilities from the Meiji period (1868-1912).
